The Pastoral Epistles

I Timothy 5:24-25 – "²⁴ The sins of some people are conspicuous, going before them to judgment, but the sins of others appear later. ²⁵ So also good works are conspicuous, and even those that are not cannot remain hidden."

The apostle Paul uses a clear contrast to demonstrate lifestyle truths. He starts with a statement about sins, then contrasts with good works. First, we need to clearly understand what we are talking about.

Within the context: Characteristic that is apart from the

These sins fit into two basic categories:
1. Those which are "conspicuous" – evident; clear to all
Galatians 5:19-21 identifies sins that are "manifest"
Adultery – marital intimacy outside of marriage
Fornication – perversity; sexually
Uncleanness – wholly abnormal in sexual
Idolatry – serving anything, or anyone other than God
Witchcraft – drug sourced magic, divinations, or spiritism
Hatred – Feuding;
Variance – Quarrelsome; always on the fight
Emulations – Indignation; malicious jealousy
Wrath – Rage; deep seated
Strife – Fighting from utter
Seditions – Bitter separations; hate filled breaking of fellowship
Heresies – A religious sect pursuing doctrines that appeal to themselves
Envying- Spite, Jealousy
Drunkenness – overindulgence with alcohol
Reveling - Lewd and sensual (Carnaval, or Mardi Gra
2. Those which "appear later" - not known until the day of judgment
