Bildad asks accusatory questions – 1-4

How long will you continue talking?

Why do you see us as beneath you, even like wild animals?

Does your plight change anything in the world?

Bildad gives an allegory description of the wicked – 5-21

\* Note \* Three interpretive options:

He is in darkness – 5-6

He walks in constant danger – 7-11

He is in a state of decaying health – 12-13

He has no home for comfort or safety – 14-15

He is a vagabond in the world – 16-18

He has no legacy of value – 19

He has a story of shame – 20-21
